

### FACT SHEET – Floorboard Paint 5L



#### Main Advantages

If your floorboards aren't in good enough condition to sand and varnish, or you simply fancy brightening them up, then choose a dedicated floorboard paint that will not only enhance the look of the wood, but protect it from every day wear and tear too. We've got just the paint.

- Can be used in any room in the house that has floorboards, from hall to children's bedroom.
- Dries to a smart matt finish (you don't want anything too shiny on floorboards as people wearing socks might slip).
- It not only looks good, it does the wood good by protecting it.

#### Prepare It

Any protruding nails should be dealt with; use a hammer and punch to knock them in. Sand off any blemishes and give the surface a good wipe over with a damp cloth and allow to dry thoroughly. Stir the paint and apply it. If your boards are really pitted or damaged you may want to put some wood filler into offending holes, splits and gashes.

#### Cover it

Depending on the porosity of the wood, you can expect a 5 litre tin to cover approximately 40m<sup>2</sup> (430 sq. ft.) with one coat.

#### Store It

Store unopened containers at temperatures above 12°C.

- This paint is polyurethane, which means tough, tough, tough. That child's bedroom floor will appreciate it.
- Great at resisting stains – just wipe 'em off.
- Comes in a choice of vibrant colours.

#### Clean It

We recommend that you dispose of paint brushes or mini-rollers after using Floorboard Paint, rather than trying to clean them.

#### The Product

A tough polyurethane paint for wooden floorboards that is available in a choice of four attractive colours.



#### Apply It

Depending on the condition of your floorboards, and the look you want to achieve, you may need two coats. If your floorboards are in good shape and you want a bit of the wood grain to show through, then one coat should be fine. However, if there are substantial blemishes then two coats are recommended, which will make them even harder wearing of course. Apply by brush or mini-roller (the kind you use for getting behind radiators). Do not use a normal sized roller as this will cause drips in between the boards, which could be a problem if you are painting an upstairs room as the paint will work its way down onto the ceiling below.



#### Drying Time

Dries in approximately 12 hours, depending on room temperature, and can then be recoated as necessary.
